<u>Leadership and Planned Gift Officer</u> American Friends Service Committee

The AFSC is a Quaker organization, which includes people of various faiths who are committed to social justice, peace, and humanitarian service. Its work is based on the Quaker belief in the worth of every person and faith in the power of love to overcome violence and injustice.

The Leadership and Planned Gift Officer focuses on the cultivation and solicitation of individuals who have the greatest potential for supporting AFSC's programs. The Leadership and Planned Gift Officer relates to donors who require the most deftly carried out cultivation leading to solicitation of major outright and planned gifts, including bequest intentions. He/she must coordinate the involvement of other development staff, program staff, and volunteers in the cultivation process so that priorities are kept in view, deadlines are met, and duplication of effort or action at cross purposes is avoided.

Qualifications:

- Possess a B.A. degree and have experience in non-profit annual giving programs; experience with capital campaigns preferred.
- Ability to communicate professionally and persuasively both orally and in writing. Ease in
 initiating contact with persons not known, in person and by phone. Demonstrated ability to
 interpret effectively the programs and goals of an organization to a wide range of persons
 of different backgrounds. Convey credibility and expertise in advising donors on
 confidential and sometimes complex financial and estate planning matters.
- Willingness and ability to travel approximately 40 % or more of each month over a wide geographical area and to work some evenings and weekends.
- Ability to work cooperatively with committees and staff, and in an organization that is characterized by a high level of consultation.
- Computer literacy required; familiarity with Raiser's Edge, Microsoft Office and the Internet desirable.
